ECS - Gr. 2 Slumberkins (Part

Note: this is program is only open to classrooms that started Slumberkins in the Winter Menu

ECS - Gr. 3 2) Worry Woos

Created to promote healthy emotional wellness, each WorryWoo adventure concludes with an upbeat message and presents the perfect opportunity to openly discuss topics that don't have easy answers.

Gr. 1 - Gr. 6 MindUP

Create an optimistic classroom characterized by focused attention, gratitude, empathy, and connection to others through Mindfulness

Gr. 2 - Gr. 8 Merrell's Strong

Students learn about emotions and the social-emotional skills, managing anger, reducing stress, and solving interpersonal problems.

Gr. 4 - Gr. 6 Big Life Journal (Adapted)

Children develop Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) and growth mindset skills through inspiring stories, colorful illustrations, and engaging guided activities.

Gr. 2 - Gr. 8 Creatology

The program aims to increase social and emotional skills, promote resilience, and hopefully reduce anxiety as students learn coping skills and self-expression

Gr. 5 - Gr. 8 My Culture In Respect*

(Targeted Group or Class)

For students to develop skills that allow them to create peaceful interpersonal relationship by being open and respectful to diversity.

*Note: This program is new to our MHCB program, but has been run by the Edmonton Francophone MHCB for a few years. The materials were developed in Quebec, so a lot of the examples are from Quebecois perspectives but we hope to adapt these as we go along.





Dear Parents,

No Secrets, a personal safety presentation, by the Central Alberta Sexual Assault Support Centre, will be delivered in your child's classroom over the next weeks/months.

This program is for children in grades K-4 with a focus on teaching children personal safety as a supportive skill and tool in the intervention of child sexual abuse. No Secrets is delivered over two 35-45 min sessions and covers topics like:

- Public vs. Private how do we treat public and private things with kindness?
- Parts of the body (including the proper names for our private parts)
- My Body Is My Own, bodies are private you can decide if you want to give a hug or a high five
- Safe & Unsafe Touching what is safe & unsafe touching?
- Safe & Unsafe Secrets what are safe & unsafe secrets?
- Personal Safety Rules Say 'No', Go, Tell a trusted adult
- Body Boundary Rules no one should look at, touch, or take pictures of our bodies without our permission.
- Safety Network who can you tell if something unsafe? like unsafe touching or secrets, happens

This presentation does not refer to child sexual abuse or sexual violence and is NOT sexual health or gender education.

At the end of the session your child will get a pencil and sticker – these have the number for our 24/7 sexual violence help line as awareness of a helping place that can be called if there are any questions or feelings related to unsafe touching.

Questions or concerns about No Secrets in your child's classroom can be directed at your classroom teacher and school administration, who have access to follow-up discussion points for parents and FAQs. Dear Parents,

iRespect US 1, a healthy peer relationship building and violence prevention program by the Central Alberta Sexual Assault Support Centre, will be delivered in your child's classroom over the next weeks/months.

This program focuses on empowering students to build and maintain understanding and respectful peer relationships and contribute to healthy schools. iRespect US 1 is delivered in one 60 minutes presentation and helps students to grow their skills and promotes respectful interactions with friends and peers. We will talk through concepts and issues like:

- What makes a good friend and the qualities of a healthy friendship and peer relationship.
- What makes a school healthy and how can students contribute to healthy schools.
- Discuss conflict and how to resolve disagreements using 'I' statements
- Discussing personal power and how we can uses our power to help and not harm others

This presentation does not refer to sexual assault or sexual violence and is NOT sexual health education.
