On December 7, 2023, a letter was sent informing parents, guardians, and caregivers that the board has approved three motions to initiate a consultation process regarding school consolidation and reconfiguration. The scenarios will include the possibility of establishing new schools upon Provincial Capital funding approval within the Wetaskiwin Regional Public Schools jurisdiction.

Winter Menu

SUGGESTED GRADE LEVEL January 8, 2024 - March 21, 2024

ECS - Gr. 1 Slumberkins

Teaching students how to be caring, confident, and resilient children, through stories and characters that promote early emotional growth.

Gr. 1-3 We Thinkers! (Volume 1 & 2)

The teachings help kids better understand themselves and others, develop self-awareness, perspective taking, social problem solving, and supports students' social emotional learning, relationship building, and learning.

Gr.2-4 The SPOT Program

Children will learn how to handle overwhelming feelings, develop a positive self-image, and learn how to improve social and emotional skills need to show empathy, compassion, and kindness.

Gr.3-6 GoZen

Students learn about: anxiety relief, mindfulness, self-compassion, resilient thoughts, and emotional intelligence through a series of videos structured like a TV show, and discussion/activities.

Gr. 3 - 6 Random Acts of Kindness

In this social emotional learning curriculum focuses on equity, teacher self-care, digital citizenship and kindness. The program connects kindness to ourselves, with kindness to others and the community.

Gr. 7-9 Healthy Relationships + (4th R)

Using open dialogue and role playing to engage students in enthusiastic discussions about peer pressure, help-seeking, media literacy, healthy and unhealthy peer and dating relationships, and healthy communication.

ECS - Gr. 8 Second Step (Part 2)

Please note: this option is only open to those who need additional time to complete Second Step, and started during the 2023 Fall Menu.

We are also offering Creatology as a Book Club, and Kindness Club, as supplementary programming to go with this menu's theme.
